CALIFORNIA LEGAL FORMS RESOURCES:

- Santa Barbara County Superior Court [www.sbcourts.org]: This is the official website for the Santa Barbara County Superior Court. It has links to the Family Law Facilitator and other self-help resources (in English and Spanish). It also has links to the Judicial Council court forms, special local forms, local court rules, information on filing fees and tentative rulings.
- Family Law Help: Judicial Council of California, Center for Families, Children and the Courts [http://www.courts.ca.gov/selfhelp.htm]: This division of the California Administration of the Courts provides general and specific information on family law matters. Step-by-step procedures for processing a case in family law are available at this site. The site now has "fill out online and print" Judicial Council forms. These forms will still need to be delivered in person or by mail to the Superior Court Clerk's Office for filing.

LEGAL HELP:

- <u>Lawyer Referral Service: [https://sblaw.org/lawyer-referral-service/]:</u> A non-profit, public service program of the Santa Barbara County Bar Association, it refers you to a lawyer. You will receive a 30 minute consultation with the appropriate attorney. Thereafter, fee arrangements will be between you and the attorney.
- Family Law Facilitator: [http://www.sbcourts.org/dv/fl/family-law-facilitator.shtm] The Office of the Family Law Facilitator is staffed by attorneys who work for the Superior Court. They help you to understand your options and to better represent yourself in family law matters. Services are FREE. They never become your attorney as they can help either side in a case. If you need to go to court, you will be in court by yourself to present your case.
- <u>Legal Aid Foundation of Santa Barbara County [www.lafsbc.org/]</u>: This non-profit agency provides free legal services to low-income residents and seniors in Santa Barbara. It has an excellent link to information on community resources.

- Legal Resource Center: [http://www.sbcourts.org/sh/lrc/index.shtm] A walk-in center for those representing themselves in Civil Court. Issues addressed include: General civil, Small Claims Court, collecting a judgment, unlawful detainer, guardianship, step-parent adoption, domestic violence restraining orders and responses, civil anti-harassment restraining orders and responses, landlord-tenant, collections, name changes and expungements.

CHILD SUPPORT:

- <u>Child Support Help: Santa Barbara County Department of Child Support Services:</u> [<u>http://css.countyofsb.org/css/home.c]</u> This is the Santa Barbara County agency that can establish parentage, get or modify child support orders and collect child and spousal support and medical support. The website does not provide tools for modification. You must contact the agency directly for assistance.
- <u>Child Support: Connect with the California Department of Child Support Services:</u> [<u>https://childsupport.ca.gov/customer-connect/]:</u> This is California's child support self-service information system designed with the customer in mind. You can use this secure self-service website 24 hours a day, seven days a week. You can get information about DCSS, update your account information, get individual case information, get payment information, make a payment, reset or change your PIN, and verify appointment dates and times. You will need your Social Security number (or Participant ID) and personal identification number (PIN) ready if you want to access case-specific information.
- <u>California Guideline Child Support Payment Calculator: [https://childsupport.ca.gov/calculate-child-support/</u>]: The California Guideline Child Support Calculator is based on California Child Support Guidelines and can be used to estimate the amount of child support that may be ordered in your case. The Court Commissioner or Family Law Judge has the final authority to determine the amount of a child support order. This calculator provides only an estimate and is not a guarantee of the amount of child support that will be ordered. Other factors may affect the amount of child support awarded.

It gives a brief overview of things to consider when developing a parenting plan.
- FAMILIES CHANGE: [http://www.familieschange.ca.gov/] This site, operated by the State of California, has guides designed for parents and kids & teens regarding separation and divorce. The site offers an online course called "Parenting after Separation." This class helps parents make informed decisions about their separation and how to put the needs of the children first. The course takes 2-4 hours depending on how quickly you work. At the conclusion of the course, you can take an exam. You will receive a Certificate of Attendance if you successfully complete the class. You can take this class and file this certificate if you are unable to attend the PEACE class in Santa Barbara County.
 - The site also offers a Parent's Guide, a Parent's Handbook, a Teen Guide and a Kids' Guide to separation and divorce. These resources are invaluable to help cope with the stresses of separation and divorce affecting you and your family.
 - The site additionally offers "Changeville," an interactive, online game where kids whose parents are separating or have divorced can go for support, advice and comfort. Changeville is a fun place to explore, with each visit providing a different set of activities and experiences. Changeville is designed to help children and youth deal more positively with a family break up. Changeville was developed by the Justice Education Society of British Columbia and has been adapted for use by the California Courts.

 - www.UpToParents.org: (1) For parents who are divorced or going through the divorce process, (2) for parents who were never married to each other, and (3) for parents intending to stay married but wishing to remember their children's needs as they work through marital problems.

- "Our Family Wizard": [https://www.ourfamilywizard.com/]: For a fee this website offers constructive help to co-parents. It is designed to help reduce conflict between parents who are co-parenting. It works online and also as an application for smart phones. It offers a parenting plan calendar, information bank, a message board, expense log, etc. It tracks communication between parents, showing the date when either parent accesses the information left for him or her by the other parent. Your imputed parenting plans, communication, expense logs, etc. will be printable.
- <u>"Talking Parents": [https://talkingparents.com/home]</u> At TalkingParents.com they keep a complete record of communications between parents. They maintain the record as an independent third party, making sure parents cannot delete or alter anything they have said. In addition to what is said, they also keep track of exactly when each communication is made, when each parent signs in or out, and even when each parent actually views a new communication.
